Conditions of Entry:

- Victorian Branch AWPAT Treasurer to pay \$1000 to the flying school of the winner's choice, on a dollar for dollar basis, on presentation of accounts or authenticated receipts. In the event of the rating costing less than \$1000 the full amount of the training will be paid.
- As the Grant was specifically set up to improve the quality of a Private Pilot's (or equivalent) flying, preference will be given to applicants not intending to go on to a Commercial Licence.
- The 1974 Memorial Grant is intended to be awarded each year; the decision of the judges will be final.
- Applications to be submitted to the Award Co-ordinator by 31 January, annually.
- Be a permanent resident of Australia.
- Hold a Private Pilot Licence and a current Civil Aviation Medical Certificate.
- Have a minimum of 100 hours total flight time – certification by CFI required with application.
- Submit a written reference from a Flying Instructor confirming adequate flying experience to undertake Night VFR Training.
- Not be currently in training for Night VFR Training.
- Be prepared to use the Award within twelve months of it being given.
